

## Street Outreach

### Overview

A basic, Take the City style unity, community street outreach initiative.

### Minimum of people needed to complete activity

- 3 to any number

### Key roles & description of each role

- Reach Coordinator (coordinating the outreach plan, training, recruiting churches...)
- Outreach Leads (people capable of initiating gospel conversations on the street)
- Outreach Workers (people willing to go along and engage, learning from outreach leads)

### Min. \$\$ needed to carry out activity

- Possibly use a few hundred dollars to purchase materials to give out (Can also get funds to purchase pocket sized Cross & Switchblades or Gospels of John...)
- Gas/Meal money for teams that go out

### Supplies needed to carry out activity

- None (except possibly materials to give out)

### Prep time for activity

- (Minimum of 1 month for prayer preparation, equipping and organizing)
- Prayer gatherings leading up to outreach
- Outreach/Evangelism Training

### Projected time of activity

- Minimum of 2 hours per outreach. This can be done any number of days and continued perpetually

### Potential partner types

- Every Home For Christ, BGEA...

### Step by step instructions to complete/carry out activity from start to finish

1. Identify any number of outreach-minded churches to partner with (they are providing outreach workers plus follow-up support).
2. Organize a series of prayer gatherings leading up to and during outreach (Luke 10)
  - a. You're asking the Lord in what areas of your community He's already working
  - b. You're asking Him to raise up "indigenous" workers in these areas whom the Lord will send you to (person of peace, we equip, they do the work of evang/disc)

- c. You're praying for the lost in those areas
3. Recruit/Identify your street outreach workers
4. Facilitate evangelism equipping training for all workers (mandatory)
  - a. Utilize on-line evangelism training series
  - b. Activation training within the group
  - c. At least half of participants must have willingness/capacity to lead an outreach pair
5. Identify Follow-Up Strategies:
  - a. Identify and equip leaders who will handle follow-up and discipleship (DBS)
  - b. Connect new believers with follow-up leaders
  - c. Connect those who need help with addiction with TC
  - d. Have a list of other local community resources
  - e. Identify potential leaders within communities to start DBS's and equip them
6. Now that you've identified target locations, recruited and equipped workers – schedule systematic outreach sending workers in groups of 2-3. The end goal is to raise up DBS's within target communities. Continue the process of recruiting and equipping outreach workers and holding prayer meetings.

#### **Day of Event Schedule (Example of a Saturday Outreach)**

- 8:15am - Bagels/Coffee for Outreach Leaders
- 8:30–9:00am - Outreach Leaders Meeting/Training
- 9:00-9:45am - Pre-Outreach Gathering
  - Welcome, Introductions, Icebreaker (15 min)
  - Worship & Prayer (15 min)
  - Evangelism Exhortation/Instructions, Team Assignments (15 min)
- 9:45am - Teams Load Up/Head Out
- 10:00am-Noon Outreach
- Noon-1pm - Teams Return, Pizza, Testimonies
- 1pm - Outreach Coordinator Responsibilities:
  - Ensure event team cleans up
  - Complete Outreach Report
  - Establish Follow-Up Next Steps
  - Add any new Outreach Workers to database/training next steps...
